with parking a vehicle so as to entirely obstruct traffic in any street or alley, or parking in such a way as to reduce traffic on an arterial street to one-way traffic only; nor to any person who refuses to move a vehicle illegally parked at the request of any member of the Police Department.

§ 71. DRIVING UPON SIDEWALK.

- (A) No person shall drive any vehicle upon a sidewalk or sidewalk area except upon a permanent or duly authorized temporary driveway.
- (B) This section does not apply to any vehicle moved exclusively by human power, to any electric personal assistive mobility device, nor to any motorized wheelchair.
- (C) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to limit or preempt the authority of the village from regulating or prohibiting the use of electric personal assistive mobility devices

§ 71.102 USE OF ROLLER SKATES, COASTERS, OR SIMILAR DEVICES.

No person upon roller skates or riding in or by means of any coaster, toy vehicle, skateboard, or similar device shall go upon any roadway except while crossing a Street on a crosswalk and except upon streets set aside as play streets when authorized by the traffic authority.

§ 72.01 GENERAL PARKING REGULATIONS.

- (A) Except as otherwise provided in this section, every vehicle stopped or parked upon a two-way roadway shall be so stopped or parked with the right-hand wheels parallel to and within 12 inches of the right-hand curb or as close as practicable to the right edge of the righthand shoulder.
- (B) Every vehicle stopped or parked upon a one-way roadway shall be so stopped or parked parallel to the curb or edge of the roadway, in the direction of authorized traffic movement, with its right-hand wheels within 12 inches of the right-hand curb or as close as practicable to the right edge of the right-hand shoulder, or with its left-hand wheels within 12 inches of the lefthand curb or as close as practicable to the left edge of the left-hand shoulder.
- (C) No person shall park in violation of signs placed by and under the jurisdiction of the state Department of Transportation which prohibit, limit, or restrict the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles on any highway.

§ 72.02 UNATTENDED MOTOR VEHICLES.

(A) No person driving or in charge of a motor vehicle shall permit it to stand unattended without stopping the engine, locking the ignition, removing the key from the ignition, effectively setting the brake thereon and, when standing upon any perceptible grade, turning the front
